Families are encouraged to immediately self-isolate and book them a PCR test.         https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-people-with-covid-19-and-their-contacts/covid-19-people-with-covid-19-and-their-contacts     </li> <li>□ Families are strongly encouraged not to present their children at club if they test positive on either a LFT or PCR test until they have completed the required isolation period.</li> <li>□ Children already in attendance at school should not arrive at the setting if they exhibit any signs of a new continuous cough or a temperature in excess of 37.8 °C or anosmia. If symptoms have appeared throughout the school day, school should already have put arrangements in place for children to isolate and be collected.</li> <li>□ Children already in attendance at the club who exhibit any signs of a new continuous cough or a temperature in excess of 37.8 °C or anosmia will be assessed by staff and recommend parents or carers collect them immediately. Wash hands with warm water and soap for 20 seconds after PPE has been removed.  All cleaning materials are double bagged and disposed of in the outdoor bins.  All surfaces that the symptomatic person has come into contact with should be cleaned and disinfected, including all potentially contaminated and frequently touched areas such as bathrooms, door handles, telephones, grab rails in corridors and stairwells. |                                   |                  |

| Inadequate hand washing & spread of Covid-19 virus to staff, children and families              | Infection<br>spread<br>leading to<br>serious<br>respiratory<br>illness, death | All building users including staff, children, catering, cleaning & site staff | High           | <ul> <li>Staff and visitors will be asked to wash their hands upon arrival in the designated bathroom in the FWBC and/or sanitise immediately upon entering the club room.</li> <li>Children will be instructed to wash/sanitise their hands immediately on arrival and before and eating/drinking.</li> <li>Children advised on correct hand washing technique (see hand wash guidance).</li> <li>Alcohol based hand cleansers/gels (containing at least 60% alcohol) can be used if soap and water are not available but is <b>not</b> a substitute for hand washing.</li> </ul> | Information posters are displayed around the setting as appropriate.  Ensure all sinks have necessary stock of hand gel, paper towels and lined bins are close by. Restock, as necessary.  Ensure all children, staff and visitors attending understand how to wash hands correctly and this is regularly revisited. | Medium           |

However, if a situation arises where staff deem it necessary, they may wear a face shield/mask in which case this will be to the discretion of the individual staff member.   | Ensure adequate bins and tissues are made available.  Ensure setting has a stock of all advised PPE including disposable gloves, aprons, face masks and eye shields. Restock, as appropriate.  | Medium           |

|   |  |   |                | ☐ Transparent face coverings or visors can be worn to assist communication with someone who relies on lip reading, clear sound or facial expression. The face shield should be wiped over with an antibacterial wipe before and after each use. Face visors <b>should not replace</b> fabric face coverings unless for the above reason |   |                  |
|   |  |   |                | ☐ When worn, and in order to minimise the risk to colleagues from used Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), it is essential that it is removed in a safe manner. To begin with, remove the apron. If you have worn gloves, remove them next by turning them inside out in one single motion.  |   |                  |
